

Implementing digital workflows can reduce patient chair time and improve lab productivity while still producing a high-quality denture! We will look at digital workflows step by step for removable prosthetics for denture clinics and some real-life metrics for increasing profitability in your clinic!

Overview: Eliminating anti-Indigenous racism in health care and achieving health equity are goals of the First Nations Health Authority (FNHA). These goals are critical in attaining FNHA's vision of healthy, self-determining and vibrant BC First Nations children, families and communities.

Join this engaging session to have a dialogue on the shared responsibilities of Indigenous cultural safety and humility and anti-racism. The session will begin with a brief reflection on the continued impacts of colonialism. Then lived experiences of First Nations people accessing oral health services will be shared to build awareness and understand of Indigenous-specific trauma and how to foster safe spaces and relationships. Traditional teachings will be weaved throughout the session. New cultural safety resources will be shared. Participants will discuss strategies for self-reflection, on-going learning and commitment to change.

About the Speakers: Connie Chong is the Manager for Provider Relations at the First Nations Health Authority, working to build a network of culturally safe health service providers for First Nations people of BC. Connie is passionate about improving health equity and inclusion and is committed to reconciliation. On behalf of the College of Opticians of British Columbia in 2017, she signed the Declaration for Cultural Safety and Humility between the BC Health Regulators and the First Nations Health Authority. She educates Boards and health professionals on cultural safety and supports transformation initiatives by building relationships between organizations. She has over 10 years of experience leading healthcare nonprofits and professional regulatory organizations and has served communities in Canada and East Africa. She holds a BA in International Relations, Master of Health Administration and a certificate in Inclusive Leadership. Connie is a mom to a very




