

Q&A with The DAC Executive Director



Dr. Talwar is a member in good standing with the Alberta Dental Association and College (ADA+C), Royal College of Dental Surgeons, Canadian Association of Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery, and the Canadian Dental Association. She is also a fellow of the Royal College of Dentists of Canada.

Dr. Talwar has been an Assistant Professor at the University of Kentucky and University of Toronto. She joined the faculty at the University of Alberta in 2010 as an Associate Professor and is active in teaching undergraduate and graduate dental students in the disciplines of head and neck anatomy, oral surgery and implants.
