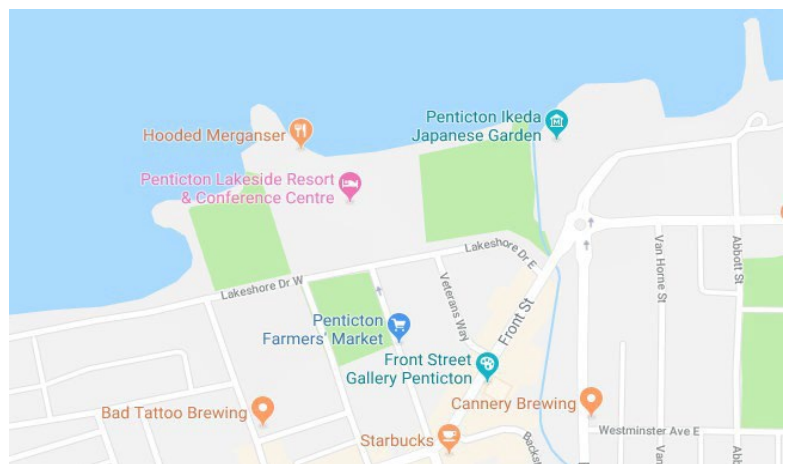

Title: The Current Landscape of Denturist Practice in British Columbia
Speaker: Allan Boos, RD

Overview: While dental implant technology has significantly progressed, our professional scope has not kept pace. In this presentation, I will explore the evolution of our regulatory framework and the limitations we currently face in our practice. I will also outline our future initiatives aimed at aligning our scope with that of other provinces in Canada and modernizing our profession to meet contemporary standards.

About the Speaker: Throughout my professional journey, I have consistently reflected on the limitations imposed on our practice as Denturists in British Columbia. I envision a future where we can operate at the forefront of technological advancements, offering our patients the diverse treatment options they deserve, and collaborating with Denturists nationwide to embrace the dental implant revolution. I graduated in 2004 from the Northern Alberta Institute of Technology with a degree in Denturism. After completing my studies, I relocated to Vancouver Island, British Columbia, where my wife, Michelle Nelson, RD, and I established a practice focused on implant restorative solutions for my patients. I have dedicated four years to serving on the executive board of the Denturist Association of BC, currently holding the position of Vice President. In 2020, I was honored to receive the Denturist of the Year award, recognizing my commitment and contributions to the profession of Denturism.

Title: "Patients, Egos and Ethics" – Communication, Treatment and Outcomes
Speakers: Bobby Birdi, DMD and Angus Young, RDT

Overview: This course will cover treatment planning, working with the patient and reaching agreed outcomes. Attendees will learn how to meet the patient's expectations while creating lasting solutions with dental treatment.

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About the Speaker: Dr. Birdi received his DMD with distinction from the University of Saskatchewan. He then moved to Minnesota to pursue post-graduate specialty training at the University of Minnesota in both periodontics and prosthodontics (6 years). He is a Fellow and previous Examiner for the Royal College of Dentists of Canada and a Diplomat of both the American Board of Periodontology and the American Board of Prosthodontics. Dr. Birdi is one of the very few board-certified dual specialists in periodontics and prosthodontics in North America, and the first and only specialist in the world to attain board certification in these two specialties in both the USA and Canada.



About the Speaker: Originally from Scotland, Angus was inspired to pursue dental technology by his father's practice as a dental technician. Since 2002, Angus has focused on CAD/CAM technology and implant restorations. He managed several commercial laboratories and a dental milling centre before starting at BC Digital Dental Studio to build a digitally focused dental lab. BC Digital Dental Studio is an in-house lab supporting BC Perio and its clinicians with patient focused solutions.



Title: Essential Strategies for Supporting Patients Struggling with Addiction and Mental Health

Speaker: Vince Galea

Overview: Participants will learn about the importance of empathy, active listening and validation in creating a safe and supportive environment for the individuals they work with. The impact of trauma and the principles of trauma-informed practice will be discussed, along with effective communication skills and de-escalation approaches for working with anxious or agitated clients.

The issue of stigma surrounding addiction and mental health will be explored, with focus on fostering understanding and empathy. Additionally, the importance of self-care and safety for staff will be emphasized, including strategies for setting respectful boundaries and seeking support when needed. This talk will provide participants with a deeper understanding of how to provide compassionate and effective care for clients struggling with addiction and mental health conditions while also maintaining their own well-being and safety.

About the Speaker: Vince brings 14 years experience working in various positions in the mental health field. He currently works at CMHA in Penticton, developing and delivering wellness workshops to the community. His previous work has included the coordination of an employment program for at risk youth and supporting individuals at transitional housing facilities. He has extensive experience with a variety of clients who display complex needs including mental health and substance use challenges and uses his facilitation skills to guide educational conversations around mental health topics.

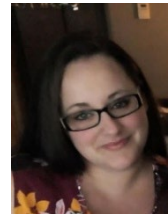

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Title: Recognizing Medical Red Flags: The Denturist's Role in Early Intervention

Overview: This presentation is designed to equip denturists with the knowledge to recognize early signs of serious health conditions and emergencies that may present during patient assessments and procedures. As many patients do not have a family doctor, chronic conditions such as hypertension and diabetes may go undiagnosed, increasing the

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risk of severe health outcomes. This session will focus on recognizing health conditions that may present with oral or facial symptoms, patient history, or general presentation, such as stroke, heart disease, and neurological disorders, among others. Participants will learn the proper technique for measuring blood pressure, a quick and easy way to screen for undiagnosed hypertension, and how to interpret the findings. This session will highlight key red flags that warrant immediate emergency care or a non-urgent medical referral, empowering denturists to play a crucial role in identifying at-risk patients and facilitating timely medical intervention.

About the Speaker: Erika Colebank, RD, is a seasoned denturist with over 20 years of experience in the field. She practiced in Duncan, BC, alongside Stephanie Yeats, RD, until 2024, when she transitioned to medical studies at the University of British Columbia's Medical Program in Victoria, BC. Erika's presentation is part of her UBC research project, aimed at improving healthcare for British Columbians. She brings a unique perspective on the integration of dental and medical care to enhance patient outcomes.



Title: Insights from a Denturist, Creating Dentures for the Last 20 Years!

Overview: Let's talk about the process of making dentures - then to now. A discussion of additive and subtractive manufacturing and how we can achieve the same excellence we have come to know with analog processing methods into today's digital denture lab with printing and milling production.

An in-depth look at Ivoclar's Ivotion Base Print, a new long term base resin, exploring its advantages and how it enhances the additive manufacturing process. We will look at real clinical considerations, and how this translates back into the lab. We will also review relevant 3Shape design perimeters and Asiga nesting information.

What factors to consider if you are looking at investing in a PM7? I've been there and done that and am happy to share all my learning with you, separating the myths from the facts based on my own experience. 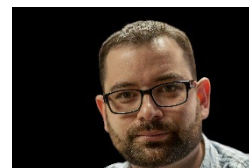
