Lost or delayed claim forms will become a thing of the past, and patient queries regarding procedures and coverage may be answered within minutes!

Digital Dentures - How to make the switch to digital workflows and increase productivity

Want to make the switch to digital denture workflows? This presentation will provide a practical look at how CAD CAM technologies can be used to drastically improve efficiency in your clinic or lab. Traditional denture fabrication consists of 5-7 patient appointments; however, with the efficiency of a digital workflow, we can now reduce that down to 3-4 patient appointments. Implementing digital workflows can reduce patient chair time and improve lab productivity while still producing a high-quality denture! We will look at digital workflows step by step for removable prosthetics for denturist clinic and stand-alone labs.

Pam Rehm is a Registered Dental Technologist working in Edmonton, Alberta. She graduated from the NAIT Dental Technology Program with honors and started her digital career designing full arch implant restorations. From volunteering as Treasurer of the CDTA, to becoming a 3Shape beta tester, she is committed to expanding her knowledge in the dental field and has a passion for furthering the use of technology in her profession. Pam started sharing her knowledge by assisting with the creation of several denturist study groups focused on implant planning for removable restorations and full arch fixed cases and now provides training for digital denture design. How Dental Implants Work: Principles of Osseointegration, Macrostructure, Microstructure, Bone Grafting, and New Technology

OUTLINE:

Implants work by connecting to the patient’s bone through a process called osseointegration. Sufficient quality and quantity of bone is also necessary for dental implant success. In cases where the bone is inadequate, bone graft materials and other materials can be used to improve the site. There are many different types of implants available on the market today and they differ in terms of size, shape, composition, and surface treatments. This lecture will review basic principles of dental implant osseointegration, bone grafting and related techniques to improve bone quantity and quality, as well as an overview of the different types of implants available and their applications. Participants will leave with an understanding of the most current evidence-based treatment recommendations for implant therapy. Emerging techniques and new developments in the field will also be presented.

- Describe the scientific basis for how implants work including osseointegration principles

She previously served as Acting Director of Graduate Periodontics and Director of Undergraduate Periodontics at the University of Michigan. She currently serves as a senior editorial review board member for Implant Dentistry and the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Research and has authored over 30 articles and 5 book chapters on periodontics and implant dentistry, including a first-authored paper in the prestigious New England Journal of Medicine. In 2015, she received the Junior Alumni of Distinction Award from Western University for her contributions to research and teaching.


