Title: Crisis in the Clinic

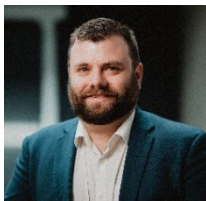
Overview: Crisis in the Clinic is an awareness course built to help prepare practitioners for medical emergencies that may present in the clinic. Patients that present to denturist clinics often suffer from multiple chronic illnesses and may be at increased risk for sudden life-threatening medical emergencies.

 - d. Neurological (Stroke, Seizures, Syncope etc..)
 - e. Other (Anaphylaxis, etc..)

Learning Outcomes

- Begin the development of a reproducible and flexible medical response plan that practitioners can customize and apply to their unique clinic setting.
- Increase familiarity with relevant illnesses and injuries that may present themselves in the clinic, to better understand a patient's past medical history and potential medical emergencies.



About the Speaker: Matt Wilson has been working in EMS for the last 18 years, in both urban and suburban settings. Throughout his career, he has sought out education roles at every opportunity. He has been a mentor for new employees, a field training paramedic for continuing education and professional development, a paramedic program instructor, and a Heart & Stroke Foundation Certified BLS Instructor. Using his pre-hospital emergency expertise, he entered the dental field to collaborate with dentists offering sedation in the non-hospital setting as a sedation assistant and consultant for dental clinics across Alberta.

Title: Navigating CDCP, NIHB, and Public Dental Programs: Practical Guidance for Denturists

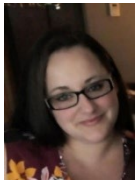
Speaker: Mallory Potter

Overview: This session will focus on practical, real-world strategies for answering patient and office questions related to the Canadian Dental Care Plan (CDCP), with additional discussion on general practice questions and other public dental programs as time permits. The presentation is designed to support denturists and their teams in navigating eligibility, coverage rules, documentation requirements, common claim issues, and patient communication. The session will begin with a focused overview of CDCP, including frequent problem areas, common misconceptions, and how to respond confidently and consistently to patient inquiries. Broader practice questions related to general practice and other public programs will be addressed to provide a well-rounded understanding of public program navigation in daily practice.

Participants will be able to:

- Respond confidently to common patient questions regarding CDCP coverage and eligibility
- Understand frequent claim issues and how to mitigate them
- Navigate documentation and communication challenges related to public dental programs
- Apply practical strategies to manage patient expectations and reduce administrative burden



About the Speaker: Mallory Potter is the Executive Director of The Denturist Association of Canada. She works closely with provincial associations, regulators, insurers, and federal partners on issues related to denturism, public dental programs, and access to care. Mallory has been deeply involved in the implementation and ongoing advocacy related to the Canadian Dental Care Plan and regularly supports denturists across Canada with policy interpretation, claims challenges, and patient communication strategies.



Title: Dispelling the Myth: Achieving Denture Fundamentals in the Digital World

Title: Trust, Teams, and Transformation: A Collaborative Blueprint for Thriving in Rapidly Evolving Environments
Speaker: Dr. Julian B. Sernik, MD, FRCSC

Drawing on lessons from orthopedic surgery, high consequence mountain environments, and leadership science, Dr. Julian B. Sernik introduces a practical framework for building trust, coordinating complex workflows, and sustaining team performance through periods of change. Designed for teams navigating rapid digital and professional change, this session offers a clear path to stronger teams, smarter implementation of innovation, and practices tailored to thrive in the next era of care.

About the Speaker: Dr. Julian B. Sernik, MD, FRCSC is an orthopedic surgeon, systems-improvement leader, and expert clinical faculty in Consultant Specialist Team Care with a professional focus on how skilled professionals can build and maintain high functioning teams that can adapt to change while preserving quality, efficiency and team dynamic.



He completed medical school at the University of British Columbia (2007), orthopedic surgery residency at the University of Alberta (2012), and a fellowship in Trauma and Lower-Extremity Reconstruction at Sunnybrook Health Sciences Centre, University of Toronto (2013). In parallel with clinical practice, Dr. Sernik completed formal leadership and improvement training through the Sauder Physician Leadership Program, Navig8 Emerging Physician Leaders Program, and Physician Quality Improvement (PQI) initiatives.

He is a certified ski guide with the Canadian Ski Guide Association and the creator of the Highly Effective Leadership Immersion (HELI) program, where he integrates lessons from trauma surgery, ski guiding, and high-performance team science to teach leadership, decision-making, and change management in uncertain environments. He is also a TEDx speaker, focusing on the universal language of collaborative problem-solving across industries.

Dr. Sernik brings a practical, operator-level perspective to conversations about modernization - grounded in real-world experience leading professionals and their teams through high-stakes transitions without losing the human and technical excellence at the core of their work.



Title: A New Paradigm in One-Day Digital Denture Workflow
Speakers: Jung-Bo Huh, DDS, MSD, PhD and Il Hwan Jang, Dental Technician, Director and Instructor (lecture with live demos)

Dr. Huh's Lecture Overview: This lecture presents a streamlined approach to complete denture fabrication, comparing a one-day digital denture workflow with a two-visit conventional protocol in which final impression and jaw relation record are obtained in a single appointment.

The session begins with a concise review of the fundamental principles of complete denture prosthodontics. Key topics include the ideal anatomical and functional form of a complete denture, determination of vertical

dimension of occlusion (VDO) and centric relation (CR), and establishment of an appropriate occlusal plane. These foundational concepts provide the clinical basis for predictable esthetic and functional outcomes.

The lecture then introduces the clinical application of the JB Tray system and the use of the JB Fork for accurate jaw relation recording. Step-by-step protocols will be explained, highlighting how these tools enable simultaneous acquisition of definitive impression and interocclusal records.

A hands-on clinical demonstration will be performed on a mannequin model, showcasing:

- Final impression taking using JB Tray
- Jaw relation recording
- Data acquisition using an intraoral scanner
- Post-scan jaw relation recording using JB Fork

In addition, a demonstration of the subsequent laboratory workflow and digital denture design process will be presented, illustrating how the captured clinical data are transferred into a complete digital fabrication sequence.

Through this integrated workflow - from chairside procedures to digital design - participants will learn how to reduce patient visits, simplify clinical procedures, and enhance accuracy and efficiency in complete denture fabrication.

This lecture is designed to provide clinicians with practical, immediately applicable protocols for both digital and conventional denture treatment in daily practice.

Il Hwan Jan's Lecture and Live Demo Overview:

Part 1: Digital Denture Design - Seamless Workflow using 3Shape & Ivoclar Ivotion

Description: The core of this presentation is the implementation of traditional analog tooth arrangement principles within a digital environment. We will explore both analog and digital denture fabrication workflows utilizing the JB tray.

In the digital segment, this session provides a comprehensive guide to efficient and precise denture design using 3Shape software integrated with the Ivoclar Ivotion module. It further covers three distinct digital fabrication concepts, focusing on maintaining sophisticated design standards while ensuring high-precision manufacturing.

Part 2: Esthetic Denture Characterization - Advanced Gingiva Festooning with Ivoclar SR Nexco (Live Demo)

Description: Elevate the artistry of your prosthetic work by mastering gingival characterization. In this live demonstration, the speaker - who holds the record for the most Nexco denture cases in Korea and has been teaching the system for five years - will showcase how to recreate lifelike gingival architecture using Ivoclar SR Nexco.

The session begins with a theoretical foundation on the textures and shades of Nexco resin, explaining the color-matching techniques required to mimic natural tissue. This is followed by a live "build-up" demonstration on a denture base, where the speaker will reveal the specific layering techniques used to achieve professional-grade esthetic results.

About the Speakers:



Dr. Huh graduated from School of Dentistry, Pusan National University, Korea in 2002. He finished the Resident program for the specialty of Prosthodontics at the Ajou University Hospital and received his PhD degree at the school of dentistry, Yonsei University, Korea in 2011. Dr. Huh is Associate Professor of Prosthodontics at School of Dentistry, Pusan National University. He has published over 80 scientific papers and five book chapters in the scientific literature for recent 5 years. He has lectured extensively about dental implant, prosthodontics, tissue engineering and regenerative medicine. Dr.

Huh is also the head of Dental Research Institute and the head in department of prosthodontics, Pusan National University Dental Hospital. Dr. Huh has been honored with "Student Research Fellowship Award" in IADR Implantology Research Group at 2009, "IADR Hatton Award" in IADR Korean Division at 2010, and "Young Scientist Award" in the Korean Academy of Prosthodontics at 2012. Recently, he was honored as the grand prize winner of the "Yeon-Song Dentistry Prize" that is most prestigious award in the field of Korean dentistry at 2018.

Il Hwan Jang is the Director of JD Dental Laboratory and a respected expert in advanced denture technology. He serves as an Ivoclar BPS Technical Instructor, Ivoclar Korea Key Opinion Leader (KOL), and Osstem Technical Instructor, contributing to the education and advancement of dental laboratory techniques.



Mr. Jang is also the inventor of the JD Device, for which he holds a patent. He holds the record for completing the highest number of Nexco denture cases in Korea and has been teaching the Nexco system for over five years.

Through international lectures and hands-on training, he shares his expertise in transitioning from analog to digital denture workflows, demonstrating innovative techniques using Ivoclar products to dental professionals around the world.



Title: The analog and digital nexus. Insights and strategies to best equip ourselves for the evolving dental landscape.

Speaker: Devaughn Fraser, Dental Technician and Director

Overview: In this 90-minute session, Devaughn explores the core principles behind the methodology, fabrication, and finishing of dental prostheses. Participants will gain practical insights into how to effectively utilize Atlantis as a personalized milling solution, streamlining digital workflows with confidence. The session will cover how to leverage digital scans to design and fabricate bars (Bridgebase) restorations, whether for temporary or permanent applications using materials such as Lucitone and PMMA. Attendees will also dive into material selection strategies - from Lucitone to Cercon - and learn how to optimize outcomes based on clinical and laboratory needs.

In addition, Devaughn will demonstrate advanced characterization techniques that elevate restorations to a higher level of esthetics and realism.

By the end of the session, participants will walk away with a deeper scientific understanding of material performance and the confidence to implement these techniques in their own workflow—setting the stage for long-term success.

About the Speaker Devaughn has worked in the health industry for 21 years - 18 specifically as a technician or as Director of Highland Dental Lab. Anticipating the morphing dental landscape, modernization began at Highland 18 years ago with the acquisition of their first in-house milling unit. Years later, the lab is state of the art with multiple scanners, mills & 3D model printers. Devaughn has received advanced design certificates from Dentsply Sirona, Vita and beyond. Further, he is numbered amongst a lucky few that are 'Global in Lab Trainers' certified in Germany, and is a software, hardware & materials beta tester. Additionally, he is a certified CEREC SPEAR mentor and shares his passion through writing for several dental publications. Devaughn self identifies as a 'tooth nerd' and can be found immersed in a dental publication or tinkering with his dental 'toys'. Devaughn is an avid outdoorsman, rugby fanatic & suffers from a congenitally defective sense of humor.



Title Is the Biofunctional Prosthetic System (BPS) still relevant in the Digital Denture Age?

Speaker: Markus Fischer, LD, LDT

Overview: As digital denture technology rapidly evolves, many clinicians wonder whether the Biofunctional Prosthetic System (BPS) still holds its place in a digital workflow. After four years transitioning from analog to digital dentures at Fischer Denture Clinic, I have found that BPS and SEMCD principles remain not only relevant but essential—and fully compatible with modern digital processes.

This presentation will outline how our team successfully integrated BPS and SEMCD into a digital denture workflow, highlighting the efficiencies gained, the challenges encountered, and the solutions that made the transition sustainable. Participants will gain practical insights into key questions surrounding digital adoption, including training pathways, equipment and software selection, material options, regulatory considerations, cost expectations, and the impact of digital workflows on denture quality. And for those who aren't ready to switch yet, I will show that analog dentures are still relevant in our current digital environment.

Attendees will leave with an understanding of how to begin their own digital journey while preserving the clinical philosophy and functional outcomes that define BPS.



About the Speaker: Markus Fischer, LD, LDT, PID, began his dental journey in 1993 as a dental technology student at Vancouver Community College (VCC). He founded his own dental laboratory in 1997 and, two years later, joined VCC as a dental technology instructor - a role he held for 15 years.

Inspired to work directly with patients, Markus became a denturist in 2006. His denture clinic took a transformative turn in 2014 when he was introduced to Dr. Jiro Abe and the BPS/SEMCD denture technique, which he has passionately embraced ever since.

A committed lifelong learner, Markus and his team at Fischer Denture Clinic have integrated digital denture technology - including design, printing, and milling - into their workflow since 2022. As a certified BPS and SEMCD instructor, he has delivered numerous courses and presentations over the past nine years, sharing his expertise with colleagues across the profession. Combining his knowledge in prosthetic implant restorations and the proven VITA VIONIC digital denture system, he is committed to delivering predictable, esthetic and long-lasting outcomes. 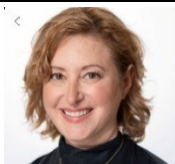

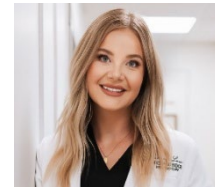

Title: AI in the Denturist Clinic: Smarter Charting, Better Patient Communication, and Reduced Administrative Burden

Overview: Artificial Intelligence is rapidly moving from theory to day-to-day reality in healthcare clinics - including denturist practices. This one-hour continuing education session will explore how modern AI tools can support more accurate patient charting, improve after-hours patient communication, and reduce the administrative load on practitioners and staff.

Presented by Dean Fenwick, founder of DOMx and long-time practice-management advisor to denturists across Canada, this session will focus on practical, real-world applications of AI rather than technical theory. Attendees will see how AI-assisted clinical documentation can transform casual chairside or post-appointment dictation into properly structured, professional SOAP notes - improving consistency, clarity, and record quality.

The presentation will also examine the growing role of AI-based phone attendance, including how AI assistants can responsibly handle missed calls, after-hours inquiries, appointment requests, and basic triage - reducing reliance on voicemail while maintaining professionalism and patient confidence.

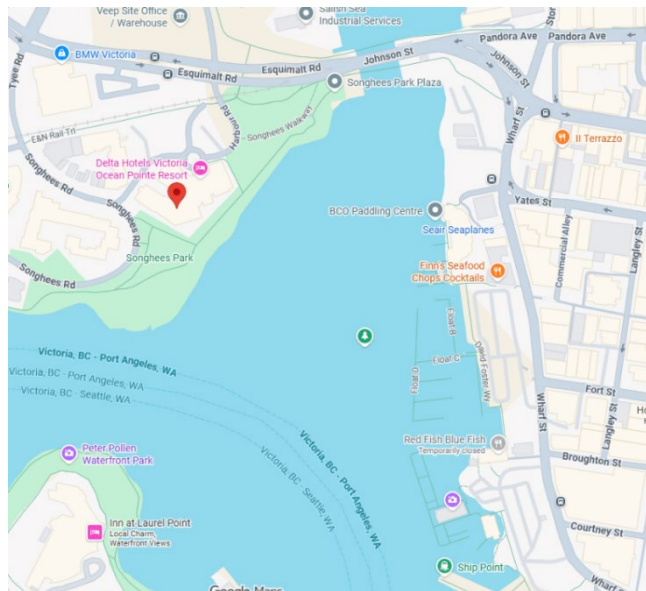
